City of West Hollywood to Host Screening of Documentary Film TRIANGLES: Witnesses of the Holocaust

Screening Will Take Place on Thu., Apr. 30 at 7 p.m. at City Council Chambers at West Hollywood Library

Funds Raised Through Screening Will Benefit Remember the Women Institute

WEST HOLLYWOOD, April 21, 2015 – The City of West Hollywood will host a screening of the documentary film *TRIANGLES: Witnesses of the Holocaust*. The screening will take place on Thursday, April 30, 2015 at 7 p.m. at the City of West Hollywood's Council Chambers/Public Meeting Room, located at 625 N. San Vicente Boulevard. Tickets are \$15 cash; no RSVP is necessary. Seating is on a first-come, first-served basis. Free validated parking is available in the five-story parking structure.

TRIANGLES was written, directed, and produced by Ann P. Meredith. Using current interviews and images from the Holocaust, Meredith weaves together a story about victims and survivors whom are often left out of history. In the film, viewers hear from lesbians and gay men, as well as other people who share their experiences and how they are still affected. TRIANGLES runs 40 minutes.

Proceeds raised through the film screening will benefit the nonprofit organization Remember the Women Institute. Founded in 1997, the Institute conducts research and cultural activities that heighten the profile of women in history. Special emphasis is on women in the context of the Holocaust and its aftermath, including post-World War II immigration. Other topics include women marginalized within Jewish religion and inter-religious dialogue, as well

as the accomplishments and exclusion of women in Jewish and general history, the effects of genocide on women, exploitation of women, and the effects of culture on memorialization. The event is co-sponsored by the World Congress of GLBT Jews, Remember the Women Institute, WeHo News, and Swordfish Productions.
